### What's happening in our classrooms?



We are well into term 2 now with students learning how to write informative sentences and how to label pictures to match their writing. We are learning lots about insects! Last




week we learnt about bees, this week we are learning about butterflies. This topic of insects will lead us into our next science unit where we will learn about life cycles of animals.

In week 5 we will be going on an excursion to Gin Gin SS for Family Frolics. Please keep an eye out for a permission letter which I will send home next week.



This fortnight we have been learning about informational texts and the ways that they are different from narratives. We have been looking at lots of information and categorising it into sections and under headings. Our favourite animal to research is the Tasmanian Devil. Did you know that Tasmanian devils are marsupials? They like to eat road kill, bones

and fur. They let off a putrid odour when they are frightened and they have a unique, loud screech.



Another exciting term of new learning is happening within our classroom. For spelling, students are taking part in explicit online lessons and their participation within these has been great so far. For English, students are learning to write in paragraphs using precise language, noun groups, verb groups and subjective and objective language. This links to the science unit where students are exploring different animal habitats. During Maths,

students have been developing their skills in converting 12- and 24-hour time and are now moving into using this knowledge to solve worded problems. Finally, for HASS, we have investigated the reasons why federation was needed in Australia and have learnt how to analyse sources and create timelines. Keep up the good work!

Reminder, homework is handed out to every student each Monday and is to be returned daily for marking.

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
